



Martin Čihák works at the International Monetary Fund (IMF) as an Advisor. He leads a unit that concentrates on mainstreaming IMF's macrofinancial analysis and policy advice. Mr. Čihák's work has covered issues such as stress testing, financial deepening, financial regulation, the state's role in finance, climate-related risks, digital money, financial inclusion, the role of gender in finance, and the nexus between finance and inequality. In 2011–2013, he was at the World Bank, where he led the Global Financial Development Report. Before joining the IMF in 2000, Mr. Čihák was a chief analyst in a commercial bank, a university lecturer, and a government advisor.
